William Campbell College is a purpose-built, special assistance school in Nowra Hill on the South Coast of New South Wales which opened its doors to students in 2023. The College offers a holistic education system to support students with social, emotional, behavioural or learning difficulties, where their specific needs are not being met by mainstream education.

Students may be disengaged from school, have suffered trauma or experienced time in out-of-home care. Incorporating trauma-informed teaching, positive education and wellbeing practices in a caring, safe and supportive environment, the College supports student's growth and achievement from years K-8.

Built on a 120-acre property, the College curriculum is enhanced by student's personal experiences outside the classroom, with a whole school focus on agriculture, horticulture, permaculture, aquaculture, music, art and crafts.
